 Health inequities related to gender, ethnicity, socioeconomic status, and geography exist in rural Nicaragua. The purpose of this research program is to improve health equity in rural Nicaragua through community-based participatory research. Prochaska's Transtheoretical model provided the framework for this program. This CBPR study utilized a stepwise, longitudinal cluster design. Pre- and post-test surveys were used to assess household pollution including kitchen layout, stove type, fuel usage, and women and children's health from 2011 to 2018. Two hundred women consented for participation in the improved cookstove program. One hundred ninety-one women were followed through to one-year post-intervention to the maintenance stage. Due to political unrest that began during the final evaluation data collection period in 2018 and the subsequent COVID-19 pandemic, face validity of the results was not achieved until June 2022.

Childhood Obesity in the Home, School, and Community

Childhood obesity is increasing to epidemic proportions in the United States. The multifactorial determinants of childhood obesity compound the difficulty in understanding this phenomenon. There is limited research that holistically examines the influence of home, school, and community on childhood obesity. To better understand the multifactorial determinants of childhood obesity, a secondary analysis of

data from the Early Childhood Longitudinal Study, Kindergarten Cohort will be examined. Bronfenbrenner's Ecological Model of Human Development will provide the framework for this study. The aims of the application are to: (1) describe the multifactorial determinants of childhood obesity, (2) explore the intra- and interrelationships, including spatial interactions, between the contexts of the home, school, community, and childhood obesity, (3) describe the difference in body mass index trajectories of children from the start of kindergarten through the end of fifth grade by food consumption, physical activity, sedentary behavior, and ecological influences. Hierarchical linear modeling and spatial modeling will be used for data analysis. Findings from this study will provide a better understanding of the multifactorial determinants of childhood obesity while providing a framework for future targeted interventions aimed at enhancing nutrition and physical activity in early childhood.

The Influence of the Home, School, and Community on Childhood Obesity: A Nested Model

Childhood obesity is rapidly increasing across the United States; however, the ecological influences of the home, school, and community on childhood obesity have rarely been explored within the same population. The goal of early childhood obesity prevention is maintaining optimal growth in childhood through energy balance: energy intake (nutrition) is equal to energy expenditure (physical activity) while maintaining normal growth patterns and preventing excess weight gain (Koplan, Liverman, & Kraak, 2005). Childhood obesity, nutrition, and physical activity are affected by ecological influences in the home, school, and community; yet, little is known about the intra- and interrelationships among childhood obesity and these ecological contexts. This gap in knowledge stimulates questions to be researched through secondary analysis of data from the Early Childhood Longitudinal Study, Kindergarten Cohort (ECLS-K; National Center for Education Statistics, 2001a; 2001b; 2004b) using the advanced statistical techniques of hierarchical linear modeling and spatial modeling. Both hierarchical linear modeling and spatial modeling are relatively new to the health sciences; and neither statistical technique has been used to study childhood obesity within the contexts of the home, school, and community.
